Context

Herefordshire faces a critical rural affordable housing shortage, and communities across the county are feeling the impact. Young people are forced to move away, older residents become isolated, and essential workers — carers, teachers, healthcare staff, farm workers — are travelling long distances because they cannot afford to live near where they work. This is holding back our economy, education, health, and community resilience.

KEY FACTS

- 1,957 households on the affordable housing waiting list
- 67 households need wheelchair-accessible homes
- Need for ~597 new affordable homes each year.
- ~2,500 homes delayed in planning, including 1,000 affordable.
- High number of Neighbourhood Development Plans, showing strong community engagement, yet lower availability of Rural Exception Sites.
- Rising second home ownership reducing availability of local housing.
- Herefordshire Council has made strong progress 276
 affordable homes in 2024/25, 65 empty homes brought back
 into use, and 1,100+ affordable homes built over the decade. But
 the need continues to outpace delivery.





Strengths

OUR RURAL STRENGTHS

- A strong "Here You Can" attitude
- Proven partnership working and committed local communities
- High uptake of NDPs showing local willingness to shape growth
- The Rural Housing Enabler to connect land, need and delivery
- Rural Exception Sites enabling genuinely affordable homes for local people
- Community-led housing, overcoming RP limitations and keeping homes locally owned
- Local SME builders and materials ready to support rural-sensitive development
- NMITE, offering innovation, engineering expertise, and a future rural construction skills base
- The Community Foundation and philanthropic landowners backing community solutions





What's Blocking Delivery?



- A planning system that stalls rural schemes despite low rural environmental impact
- Lack of infrastructure investment due to not collecting CIL
- Rural stock disposal and limited rural engagement from some Registered Providers
- A national housing system built for cities, not villages
- Second homes further restricting supply
- Over-focusing on problems and blaming instead of collaborating





Our Opportunity

ONCE IN A LIFETIME

The redrafting of the Local Plan is a once-in-a-generation chance to embed:

- Rural Exception Sites
- Community-led housing
- Small-site delivery
- Local builders and materials
- A rural construction skills pipeline with NMITE

Our Call to Action



JOIN FORCES - JOIN THE RURAL AFFORDABLE HOUSING STEERING GROUP

- **Purpose:** Establish a collaborative group to create practical, sustainable solutions for affordable housing in rural Herefordshire.
- **Need:** Rural areas face housing shortages, high costs vs. incomes, infrastructure challenges, and risks to community sustainability.
- **Objectives:** Map housing needs, identify delivery barriers, explore innovative models, develop design frameworks, consider wellbeing factors, and produce an options report with a strategic action plan.
- **Scope:** Focus on rural Herefordshire (excluding Hereford city and large towns), covering all affordable tenure types (social rent, shared ownership, community-led, self-build).
- **Membership & Working:** Includes councils, housing providers, developers, community groups, health, economic partners, and academics; quarterly meetings, chaired by Frank Myers, taking an evidence-led approach.
- **Key Deliverables (Year 1):** Evidence & Options Report, Strategic Action Plan, pilot project identification, and recommendations to inform local strategies.
